Canada-Ontario Job Grant Program

Get Government Aid to Pay for Customized Employee Training

The Canada-Ontario Job Grant offers financial assistance with employment training and development programs. Qualifying businesses can receive up to \$10,000 in government support per person for training costs. What is the Canada-Ontario Job Grant?

The Canada-Ontario Job Grant provides direct financial support to individual employers who wish to purchase training for their employees. The objective is to meet the unique needs of businesses that do not have the capacity to develop the training.

Here are some important points to be aware of:

- It is available to qualifying small, medium and large businesses with a plan to deliver short-term training to existing and new employees.
- Employers are required to contribute one-third of the total costs, and can receive up to \$10,000 in government support per person for training costs
- There will be additional flexibility for small businesses to provide an in-kind contribution towards their share of the costs.
- Training must be delivered by an eligible, third-party trainer.

Septic Systems

Get to Know Your Septic System:

Know the location of your septic tank and what sort of material it is made from. Know the size and shape of your leaching bed.



Maintain Your Septic System Properly:

Have your septic system inspected at least every three years.

Pump your septic tank as needed (generally every three to five years).

Have the tank replaced if not sound (e.g. steel tanks are susceptible to decay and last only 20 to 25 years) or if undersized for sewage flows.

Keep records of pumping, maintenance and repair.

Be Careful About What Goes Into Your Septic System:

Take household hazardous wastes to a municipal hazardous waste facility. If you pour wastes such as paint or grease down drains or into toilets, they can seep into the groundwater. They may also prevent your septic system from working properly.


